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 The ninth *Occupational Health [at Work]* legal and practice update provides a unique and comprehensive guide to recent, scheduled and expected changes to the law, codes of practice and official guidance in occupational health, health and safety, disability and professional practice. Among the domestic highlights is the introduction, from 2014, of the health and work assessment and advisory service (HWAAS) and, to encourage use, tax relief for interventions recommended by it; the continuation of reforms to the employment tribunal system to encourage the early resolution of disputes in the workplace; further changes to the health and safety regime following the recommendations of the Löfstedt review; the end of the NHS Plus project, with its work taken forward by the NHS Health at Work network; and changes to the DVLA's medical standards. On the horizon is the introduction in May of UK regulations transposing the sharps and needlesticks directive. May 2013 is also the second registration deadline under the EU REACH Regulation, and applies to companies manufacturing or importing substances in quantities of at least 100 tonnes annually.
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
